

He Paid it forward without ever knowing it.

Recently I visited Albania to provide free dental care at a missionary organization. This was my seventh trip in the past 19 years but it was the first time in 18 years that I spent the whole time in Tirana the capital city. My first visit was in 1992 two weeks after the end of communism. All the citizens of the nation were employed by the government. The dentists I met made \$14 per month — but at least a loaf of bread was only five cents.

A friend of mine Irwin Stobbe DDS retired and donated his entire office contents consisting of chairs, x-ray machine, instruments, supplies, materials, and sterilizer. By some process I can't recall, all the stuff was shipped at no cost to Albania. I do remember it went by boat to Holland and then by truck to Tirana. The Bosnia war was going on so the driver was paid an extra thousand dollars to take the container through the war zone.

When my team of six arrived in Albania all of Dr. Stobbe's stuff was in the living room of Dr. Muci Myzyri. We set up a dental clinic in his house and on the front porch. I had never seen amalgam mixed by mortar and pestle. When I started prepping a cavity Dr. Myzyri started the hand mixing process. I asked him how he knew it was mixed right and he said when it sounds like the crunchy sound made when walking on snow then he would roll it in his bare fingers. Some of our luggage had been delayed in Rome for a few days so when the Wiggle Bug amalgamator arrived my wife popped in a capsule and in 15 seconds dumped the contents into Dr. Myzyri's hand. I saw him hold it near his ear as he rolled it in his fingers and then give an approving smile. The machine-mixed amalgam sounded "right". We left all the stuff in his living room. I think he was the first dentist in private practice in Albania at that time.

Fast forward 19 years. I am back in the capital city, recovering eight boxes of supplies, a cardboard dental chair and air compressor and vacuum that I left after my visit to a distant town three years ago. I brought three suit cases of current anesthetic and supplies. But I don't have an amalgamator. I won't be able to use my Fuji IX or amalgam without one so I head out by dead reckoning for a house I haven't been to for 18 years in a town without phonebooks or decent street signs.

I find the street, then the address but it looks different. I see a steel door inset into a sheet metal garage door. After I push the door bell Mrs. Myzyri opens the door and immediately recognizes me. She took me up two flights of

stairs above the carport where my old colleague now has a nice two chair dental suite. New Italian over the patient delivery, video monitor for an intraoral camera is attached to the patient light pole — as well as a computer monitor plus a soccer game playing on a TV. As I looked around I recognize some equipment such as a little cylindrical shiny chrome Harvey Chem-clave, an art deco Wiggle Bug amalgamator and a old GE Xray machine mounted to the floor. Dr. Stobbe's stuff was still in use! I was able to borrow the Wiggle Bug for the week.


After we left in 1992 Dr. Myzyri continued to practice in his living room using the donated equipment and supplies. Then after seven years he tore down the brick wall that was topped with broken glass pushed into wet cement. In its place a narrow three story building was built which had a carport at ground level. The second level was storage and the third floor was the dental clinic.

In 1992 his son was seven years old and I told Muci, "even though you got all this stuff for free you can't provide treatment for free like we did for the past two weeks. You are going to have to charge more than what the cost is to replace the materials that you consume." I think he made the transformation from communism to capitalism successfully. Nineteen years later creates a better perspective to appreciate the power of generosity. Not only is Dr. Myzyri earning a nice living in an attractive office with a Mercedes parked downstairs but Kejdi his son is now 26 years old and practicing dentistry with his father. The legacy of Dr. Stobbe's generosity is still paying dividends now to a second generation.

I hadn't seen Irwin Stobbe in years. He lived just a block from my old office. When I got back in October I found only one "Stobbe" in the phone book. A lady answered and told me the sad news that Irwin had died a couple years ago. I told his widow the whole story and she said he would have been so glad to hear his stuff was put to good use. He once told me his parents were very active with the Salvation Army. I'm sure they had demonstrated a lifetime of generosity and service to others. When I was in Junior High I used to pull skeet and trap for Dr. Stobbe, earning \$1.25/ hour. That added up to a whopping ten dollars a day! — Along with the risk of any one of five guys with a 12 gauge mistaking my hat for a clay pigeon. I wonder if it was the 12 gauges or the "Quiet Air" that caused the ringing I hear.


In Recognition of Dr. Emilio Garcia and the Crowns for Kids Program

It is time once again to lend your support for the Give Kids a Smile Program and S.O.S. Sealant Clinic at FCC. Volunteers need not be in dentistry to help, as we have need for bilingual team members fluent in Spanish and Hmong languages.

Because of your past efforts, we have been able to provide restorations, cleanings and thousands of sealants for more than 1000 children in our community. This would not have been possible without the broad range of support of our dental community.

This year's program will be our best yet. We will run the Give Kids a Smile restorative clinic at local dental offices, with children being screened and bussed from the Fresno City College Dental Hygiene Clinic. At FCC, we have opened up the clinic for prophys and sealants to all 2nd through 6th grade students on a first come, first served basis. We plan to begin by about 8:15 AM for orientation and to get situated in an operatory. The last patients will be seated at 11:30 AM. Treatment hours at the dental offices

will be 10:00 AM until 2:00 PM. There is a great need for doctors to provide restorative services in local dental offices, as well as provide care at the 30 operatories at FCC. We welcome DDS, RDH and RDA team members to help place sealants and provide prophy's and fluoride treatments to make this day a success. As in years past, we ask you to bring the following supplies for your own personal use:

Personal Protective Equipment: Clinic jacket, glasses/shield (your preference). Bring gloves if you have special requirements, otherwise a variety of sizes of latex gloves will be available

For those providing dental care, if you have preferred them. We will have a broad range typical dental supplies-burs, slow-speed handpieces and curing lights for your use.

For those providing dental sealants at FCC, it would be helpful if you could bring your own curing light. We have approximately 15 available and have need of 25. You will use your own light. Please label your light with your name and phone number.

Volunteers are also needed to help with processing patients, sterilization, assisting, placing sealants, minor scaling, prophys and fluoride treatments. Several doctors will be needed for screening patients as they are brought into the clinic. Bring your staff if you can. We'd love to see a large number of dentists and their team members as this is FMDS's premier community dental outreach program.

If you can participate, please fill out the form included with this memo, and fax or mail it to me as soon as possible. Please indicate your preferred work location, as we can use doctors both providing pediatric restorative care and placing sealants. I will forward details of the day and directions to the Dental Hygiene clinic. Your participation is greatly needed and valued! We look forward to working together with you. 


